



This is an overview of the main areas of learning in Year 3 for this week which will link to the learning going on in school.

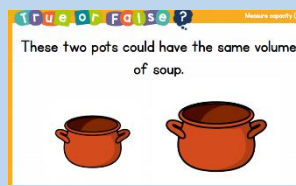
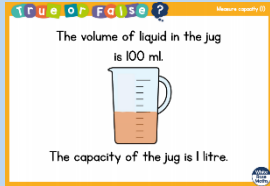

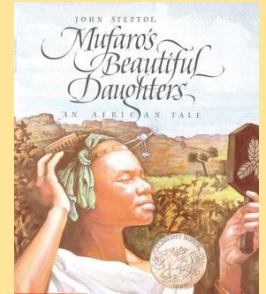
English

- They only wanted Romans to be able to read and write.**

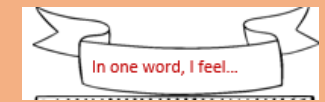
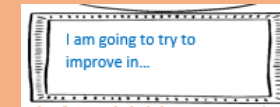
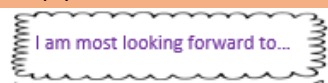
Complete the 2Do on Purple Mash to create a non-chronological report about what the Romans did for us. When you are finished it can be shared on the year 3 display board.
