Practise your 2's, 5's and 10's rolling numbers each day, can you get quicker each time? Can you teach someone else how to do their rolling numbers?</p>	<p><b>English – Riddles</b> <b>Lesson 1:</b> Think of an animal that lives in the jungle. Draw this animal on a piece of paper, then write as many adjectives as you can to describe it. Think about how it looks, how it sounds and how it might move. <b>Lesson 2:</b> Come up with some similes to describe the animal that you chose yesterday. A simile is when you use the words 'like' or 'as' e.g. the snake is as long as a piece of spaghetti or the snake's skin is bumpy like bubble wrap. <b>Lesson 3:</b> Revisit similes - think of 3 different animals and come up with a simile for each one. <b>Lesson 4:</b> Watch this <a href="#">video</a> about riddles. Can you solve the riddle? Once you've solved the riddle, can you come up with a riddle to describe an animal of your choice? You could use adjectives you came up with in lesson 1 to help you. Send your riddle to your teacher via <i>2email</i>. <b>Lesson 5:</b> Perform your riddle to someone at home. Can they guess what your riddle was about?</p> <p><b>Phonics:</b> Recap your Phase 3 sounds by watching this <a href="#">video</a>. This week, we are learning two new sounds. Click on the links to learn our new sounds <a href="#">ea</a> and <a href="#">ie</a>. Can you think of any real and alien words for these sounds? Complete the 'ie, ea, oy' phonics <b>2Do</b> on PurpleMash. Our tricky words for this week are <b>do</b> and <b>some</b>. Can you put our tricky words into sentences?</p> <p><b>Reading:</b> When you read your book, see if you can answer the following question: What happened in the story? Think of three sentences to help you describe the beginning, the middle and the end.</p>
<p><b>Irresistible Learning – Continents</b> This week, we are learning all about the continents that make up the world.</p> <p>Do you know how many there are? Complete this <a href="#">lesson</a> on Oak Academy to learn about the continents.</p> <p>Here is a <a href="#">song</a> that can help you remember the continents.</p> <p>Have a go at labelling the continents on the <i>World Continents 2Do</i> set on Purple Mash.</p>	<p><b>Wellbeing</b> This year, we have talked lots about our feelings using the book 'The Colour Monster'. Can you remember how the colour monster feels when he is yellow? Join in with this <a href="#">BBC Supermovers</a> to give you a clue.</p> <p>You're right, he feels happy. Think about what makes you feel happy. Can you draw a picture of all the things that make you happy? Once you've drawn them, think about why they make you happy.</p>
