This is an overview of the main areas of learning in Year Reception for this week which will link to the learning going on in school. Please use these as the main activities for remote learning if your child is unable to attend school during this week. Please send pictures of your child's work to their teacher via Evidence Me.

Number, shape & measures:

Lesson 1: [Number of the week 7](#) How could you represent the number 7?

Shape of the week: Listen to this song about a [cone](#). Can you make a cone shaped party hat?

Lesson 2: Have a go at making your own balance scales using a coat hanger and some cups or bags. Place items in each side. Use the words heavier and lighter to describe your results. For a challenge try to make the scales balance.



Lesson 3: Get an apple and have a hunt around your home to find things that are lighter and heavier than it. You could use your balance scales to check if you are correct. Can you find anything which is larger than the apple but lighter?

Lesson 4: Collect a selection of containers and investigate which holds the most by using a small cup of water to fill each container and counting how many cup-fulls the containers hold. Try to use the words empty, half full, nearly full and full, as you go.

Lesson 5: Find a tall narrow container and a wide shallow one. Predict which will hold the most water then investigate to find out if you were right.

The World/topic

Activity 1: Listen to the story [Lost and Found](#)
