Topic: River Deep, Mountain High (Geography)

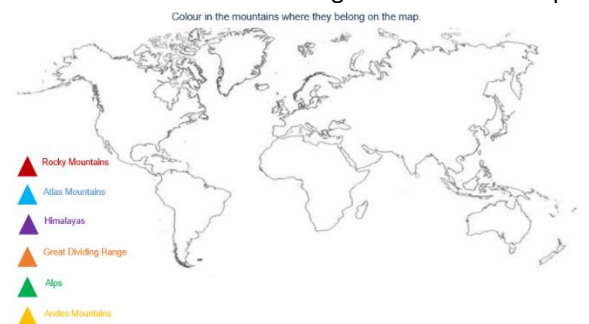

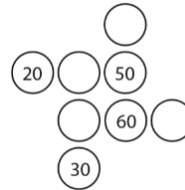
