



Topic- Toys

Old and New Toys

Click on **Purple Mash** on RM Unify > select **2Do** tab at the top and watch the **Old Toys slideshow**.

TIP: Which toys look old? Why do you think this?

Activities:

- Ask a grown up about the toys that they used to play with. Do they still have some of their old toys or pictures of them?
- How are they the same or different to your toys?
- Can you draw or paint a picture of the old toys?

Science

Science Experiment

Toy Freeze

Fill a tub with water. Which of your toys will float or sink?
Put the tub in the freezer.

Ask: *Which items do you think will freeze at the top?*
Which items do you think will freeze at the bottom?

Tip the ice block onto a tray and discuss what has happened to the toy.

Let the children explore the ice block and how it melts. They can try to free the toys as the ice is melting.

TIP: You will need a container and a variety of small waterproof toys

Challenge - Addition and Subtraction

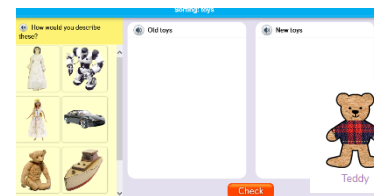
Use a dice or number cards to select 2 numbers. Add or subtract the 2 numbers using objects to help. You could use a number line to count the jumps. This could be drawn out with chalk or on paper.



TIP: Encourage your child to think about whether they count forwards or backwards and remind them to subtract the smaller number from the bigger number.

TIP: Encourage your child to think about how it feels. Is it soft, hard, heavy or light?

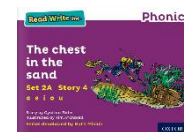
