French: This week use a card game to learn some new places.

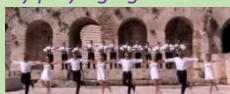
On one set of cards write the places below in **French**. On another set, write the places in English.

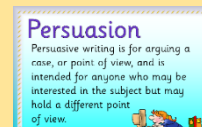

SPaG: Grammar: Complete the [Oak lessons](#) 4&5 to explore pronouns.

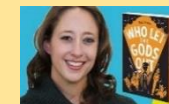
