Children under the compulsory school age who are in full time education may also be entitled to receive free school meals.






Parents Evening

Multiplication Check

► The national curriculum specifies that pupils should be taught to recall the multiplication tables up to and including 12 × 12 by the end of Year 4.

► Pupils must recall the answer to a times table question within six seconds.

► This check will help us to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided.
