


Number, shape & measures:

Number of the week: 16

Shape of the week: Hexagon. A hexagon is a 2D shape with 6 sides and 6 corners. Listen for the 'x' sound in the words six and hexagon.

Challenge:

This week in school we are learning about doubles. A double is finding the total of two equal groups. Try painting some spots on one side of a piece of paper. Fold it up and watch double the amount of spots appear as you reopen the page. Can you discover the doubles of numbers 1 to 10?

Activity 1: Listen to the story '[The Very Hungry Caterpillar](#)' by Eric Carle. Can you remember what the caterpillar ate? You could write a list of the foods. What do you know about caterpillars and butterflies? On Espresso search 'A butterfly's life cycle' and read the studio board.




Reading: Read some of your books on [Bug Club](#).
