

Phonic Screening

In year one children will be assessed on their phonics through the phonics screening.

Assessment of phonic decoding.

It consists of 40 words, half real words and half pseudo words, which your child will read to their teacher.

The threshold in 2023 was 32 out of 40 (80%).

The pass mark will not be released for 2024 until after the test is administered.

Children should not realise that they are being formally assessed.

The check should be seen as part of their everyday phonics




Reading a book at the right level child should:

- Know all the sounds and tricky words in their phonics book well
- Read many of the words by silent blending (in their head) – their reading will be automatic
- Only need to stop and sound out about 5% of the words by the time they bring the book home but they should be able to do this on their own.



Books going home



Children will take home a phonetically decodable book every week – children should be able to read this book without your help. These books should be returned every week on a Friday.


Sharing books will also go home. These can be changed as often as the children desire but will not be recorded in their reading records. These are not phonetically decodable, but to encourage their enjoyment of reading.


Children will also get the chance to go to the library once a week and choose a book to take home. These books


