Maths

This week we will be looking at exploring calculation strategies using place value, start on [lesson 6](#) complete a new lesson every day.

Challenge:

Using place value counters, how many different ways can you make four hundred and fifty?



Show your solutions as a calculation

Fluency:

How well do you know your halves? Focus on numbers to 30 and see how quickly you can recall the halve facts. You can try it in order to start with if it helps and then work on up to 40 or even beyond.

Irresistible Learning:

Geography: Can you find out some facts about Tobago, the place where Gregory visits his grandparents? Look at this [information](#) and see if you can answer these questions.

What does the flag look like? What animals live there? What sea is it in? What is the climate like?

You could also create a fact file, one has been set as a 2Do, then share it on our year group display board.

Art:

Use the illustrations from the storybook [Gregory Cool](#) draw a picture of the beach or of Gregory's grandparent's house. Look carefully at the pictures and how colourful they are, look how the illustrations reflect the hot, sunny weather. Can you do the same with your picture? You could draw yourself and your family in the pictures or the characters from the story.




