English – The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch

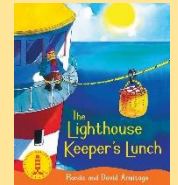
This week we are starting to look at our next key text, The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch
