Irresistible Learning: Out of Eggs

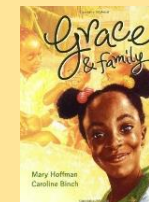
PSHE (Activity 3) – our theme this week is **collaboration** (working together). You might want to have a go at this activity with a member of your family at home:

- Guide your family member, who has their eyes shut/blindfolded, across the room without them stepping onto the cones. Who can do all of the course or most of the course without stepping on a cone?

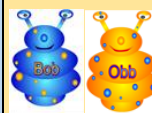
English
