Irresistible Learning: (River Deep, Mountain High)

Activity 1: How does the temperature change as you climb a mountain? Watch [this](#) BBC Bitesize clip of Steve Backshall climbing Snowdon in North Wales. He records height and temperature at regular intervals with an altimeter and explains how temperature changes as you climb.

Activity 2: Explore the Alps. The Alps are a large mountain range in the middle of Europe. Click [this](#) BBC Bitesize link to learn about how the Alps were formed and what it is like there. Watch the videos, read the text and play the quiz.

Activity 3: Create an advert to encourage tourists to visit the Alps. Tourism is the main industry in the Alps. Around 30 million people visit the Alps each year, enjoying activities such as skiing and snowboarding, walking, sightseeing, train running, mountain biking and paragliding. Your task is to use what you have learnt to create an advert encouraging tourists to visit the Alps. You could create a poster, leaflet or record an advert like you see on the television. **Please share this work to the 'Year 4 Mountains' Display Board.**

RE DAY FOCUS – Special religious journeys

This week, we are looking at special religious journeys that Sikhs make. A pilgrimage, or **yatra**, is when people travel to a place of worship that is usually far away. Some Sikhs choose to go on a pilgrimage to The Golden Temple (Harmandir Sahib). The benefits of pilgrimage for Sikhs include:

- strengthening their faith
- providing time dedicated to spiritual reflection
- learning more about the history of Sikhism and the Gurus' lives
- helping them better understand the principles of Sikhism

Task: Research answers to these questions to learn more about the Golden Temple. Where is the temple? What is it made of? Who started making it? What does it symbolise for Sikhs? What rituals must you follow when you go inside? What will you/won't you find inside? Who can go inside? (Are there any special features for this?) What is langar? [This website](#) might help you.
