Jack goes surfing for  hours. It costs him £34 to hire the surfboard.

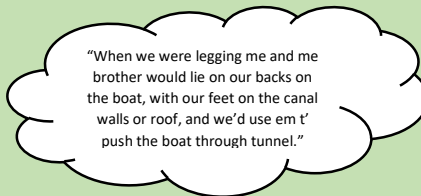
## Irresistible Learning Topic Made in the Midlands
