Maths

Oak Academy: Fractions and Turns



Challenge

Task 1: Complete the *Fractions and Turns* 2Do's on Purple Mash.

Task 2: You will need a target (basket or container) and 4 soft items to throw (rolled up socks work well!). Stand 2 metres away from the target and throw the 4 items, trying to hit the target each time. Record your score as a fraction out of 4 e.g. 3 hits out of 4 would be $\frac{3}{4}$. Move your target further away to make it more of a challenge!

Mental fluency:

Rolling Numbers – can you remember how to roll your 2s, 5s and 10s? Show someone at home!

[Hit the Button](#) – practise your number bonds to 10. How many questions can you answer before the time runs out?

Additional Writing - Animal Fact File

Task 1: Look and read the information about elephants by logging on to [espresso](#), in the search bar type in 'elephants' on click on the second link and read some fantastic facts.

Task 2: Start to create a fact file on the elephant including a picture of them. Can you write a sentence/s about their appearance (what they look like) and their diet (what they eat),

Task 3: Continue with your fact file – write a sentence/s about their habitat (where they live) and any other interesting facts you found about them.
