$\begin{array}{r} 36 \quad 65 \\ +29 \quad +14 \\ \hline 65 \quad 79 \end{array}$	$\begin{array}{r} 36 + 30 = 66 \\ 66 - 1 = 65 \\ 65 + 14 = 79 \end{array}$	$\begin{array}{r} 36 + 14 = 50 \\ 50 + 29 = 79 \end{array}$
