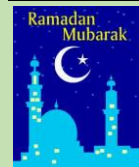
Irresistible Learning: Journeys into the Unknown

Oak Academy: Persuasion: Why you should never light fires in a dry forest - complete a new lesson each day (lessons 6-9).

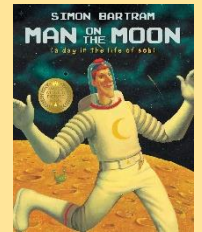
