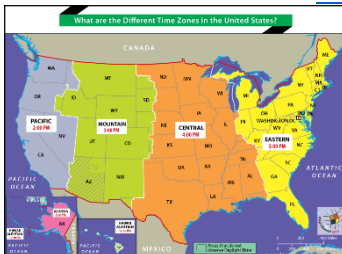


Year 5 – Week 5 – Weekly Activities
