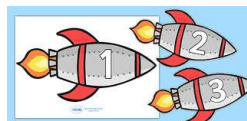
- Listen to some “Space” music, draw/paint a space picture while you listen: Gustav Holst- The Planets (available on YouTube)

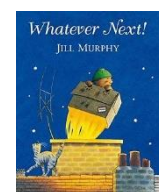

- Writing: Practise writing your name in lower case letters.
- Practising pencil control by drawing round shapes to make a rocket picture
- Can you think of any words that rhyme with moon [soon, spoon, noon, tune] or star [car, tar, far, jar]
- Phonics: Introduce the letter ‘m’ [mmm] What sound does it make? What does the letter look like? How do we write it? What objects begin with ‘m’? [monkey, moon, money, mouth etc.]
