## Miss Kamudu's Nepal Adventure

Luckily, this Easter, I had the most wonderful opportunity to have an adventure in Nepal to continue the support Gig Mill provide to Classrooms in the Clouds (CITC). Dawa Geljen Sherpa, the Founder of CITC, is one of the most inspiring people I have ever met. His vision to provide opportunities for Nepalese children to receive an education, particularly in the most remote villages, has motivated many people to support his charity and join him to achieve this dream. Our group of local teachers and school governors were on a journey to see the amazing work of the charity, first-hand.

My trip involved 6 planes, 2 helicopter rides, an extremely bumpy journey in a jeep and three days of trekking and scaling the beautiful landscapes of Nepal. Our trek included: a long, steady walk along a bridge crossing a river, sourced by Mount Everest, camping in tents, in gardens and rice fields, as well as eating the most delicious Nepalese cuisines, cooked by our own special team of Sherpas. During my assembly, the children were very excited and interested to hear about and see all the photos from Nepal. It was wonderful to see their reactions to the way of life in Nepal and left assembly feeling grateful for the opportunities they have.

On this trip, I was particularly humbled to see the impact of this charity's work for so many children in Nepal and to witness the brand-new classrooms, which so many children in our school have contributed to, due to the sales they have undertaken.
