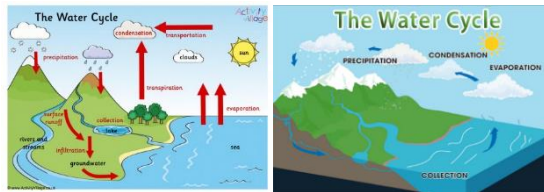


Year 4 – Week 4 – Weekly Activities
