White Rose: Multiplication & Division (For each lesson watch the video by clicking the link and then complete the worksheet set as a **2Do** on Purple Mash.)

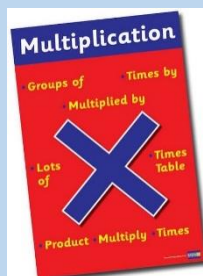

Science- Plants

This week we are looking at plants. Watch this [video](#) to learn about what a plant needs to survive. Plants are very important as they help animals and people survive.



Activity 1: Make a poster showing what a plant needs to survive. You could do this on paper or on Purple Mash using the 'How Plants Grow' **2Do**. Have a go at sharing your work to the '**Year 2 Plants' Display Board** on Purple Mash.

Activity 2: Investigate where plants grow best. You could find something to plant and see where it grows best (in a cold dark fridge or on a window sill).

Activity 3: Complete the 'Trees Labelling & Growing' **2Do** on Purple Mash, looking at what trees need to grow.

Art - Activity 4: Find a plant in your home or outside and try drawing it. Look carefully at the detail and try to colour it in the correct colours.
