Maths

This week we will be looking at securing multiplication and division using Oak Academy. Start on [lesson 1](#) and complete a new lesson every day.

Challenge: Can you solve these 3 problems?

Art: Design your own Easter card to give to someone in your family. Look at these pictures of cards to help you and use and adapt any art and craft materials that you have at home.



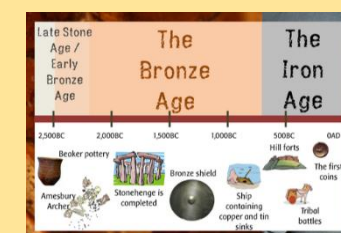
English
