Dear Parents and Carers,

Firstly, I do hope you are all safe and well.

Next week you will receive your child's annual report. Either this will be by email (if you have provided an email address), or a copy will be handed to children currently in school. The report format has slightly changed this year as we are not able to complete children's reports as they are not with us in school. You will notice that next week on our home-learning planning there is a transition activity for everyone to take part in.
